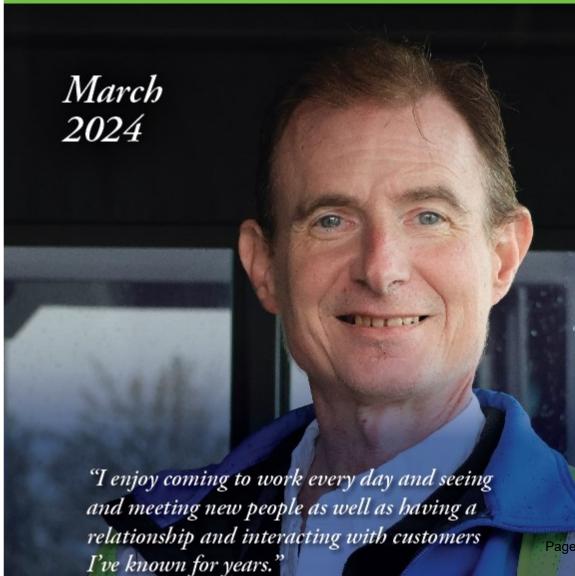

#### **OPENING REMARKS AND HOUSEKEEPING ITEMS**

Vice Chair Whalen welcomed board members, staff, and citizens to the meeting and provided attendees with instructions for meeting participation.

#### **PRESENTATIONS**

#### 1. Honoring Richard Bartholomew for Operator of the Month for February 2024.

Assistant Transportation Manager Scott Gaines honored Mr. Bartholomew for being selected Operator of the Month for February 2024. He detailed his attributes and contributions to the agency and to the community, highlighting that he has been serving the community since 2018, serves as a mentor to operator trainees, and goes the extra mile to help passengers and coworkers. He read complimentary comments that passengers have submitted relating to the service that Mr. Bartholomew provides.

On behalf of the Board, Vice Chair Whalen congratulated Mr. Bartholomew for his achievement.

### 2. Honoring Joseph Rochon for Being Selected Employee of the Year for Calendar Year 2023

Assistant Transportation Manager Scott Gaines honored Joseph Rochon for being selected Employee of the Year for 2023. Mr. Gaines reported that Mr. Rochon possesses an outstanding work ethic and customer service skills and has been with Pierce Transit for 34 years. He reported that he has an extra safety record, has never had a preventable accident, and is a member of the 2 Million Miler Club. [*Commissioners Mello and Diaz arrived at approximately 4:07 p.m.*] He read complimentary comments that passengers have submitted relating to the service that Mr. Rochon provides.

On behalf of the Board, Vice Chair Whalen applauded Mr. Rochon for the great work and service to the community and for his 34 years of service.

#### 3. Update: Customer Experience Plan Actions

Chief Planning Officer Ryan Wheaton gave an overview of Agency's efforts for implementing the second and third goals of the Customer Experience Plan since December. He reminded attendees of the routes that will be eliminated and replaced with Runner service that will go into effect with the March 31 service change.

Mr. Wheaton reviewed the outreach and communication efforts for the new Pacific Avenue/SR-7 service and to inform customers about the change as well as efforts to work with the affected SHUTTLE customers to transition them to SHUTTLE, where possible, and to continue to work with those to find a solution.

Mr. Wheaton closed his presentation advising the commissioners to let staff know if they would like the agency to connect with a particular community group.

#### 4. 2023 Interim Productivity Standards and Ridership Data

Service Planning Assistant Manager Andrew Arnes presented on the item and recapped the history and reasoning for implementation of the interim standards in December 2022, noting that a combination of changes in rider behavior and a decline in ridership due to the pandemic supported the need for interim standards.

Mr. Arnes gave an overview of the methodologies used to create the interim standards and advised the agency will be working on developing performance standards for ridership for implementation in the Long-Range Plan.

The Board reviewed data for the following categories and engaged in question-and answer period with staff on the following:

- 2020-2023 Average Ridership Recovery Comparison
- 2019 -2023 Passengers Per Service Hour Comparison
- 2019-2023 Passengers Per Revenue Mile Comparison
- 2023 Route Rankings for meeting productivity
- 2019-2023 Ridership Boardings for all modes of service
- 2022 vs. 2023 Boarding per Service Hour for Top 5 and Bottom 5 Routes
- 2022 -2023 by Quarter, Runner Boardings by Zone
- Youth Ride Free Boardings and trends/locations where boardings are occurring
- 2023 Transit Center Boardings
- April December 2023 ORCA LIFT Boardings by Route

Upon inquiry from Commissioner Kastama, A discussion and answer period ensued about farebox recovery trends and statistics. CEO Griffus advised that of various programs that have been implemented over the years that has reduced farebox recovery efforts such as Youth Ride Free Program and ORCA LIFT program.

#### 5. Overview of Pierce Transit Board Composition Review Process

Aaron Millstein, Counsel for KL Gates, provided an overview of the Board Composition review process. He reviewed the statutes that govern the process and advised that the review process is required every four years and noting that the review process will be held this year. He reviewed the service area, current board composition, and population estimates for each jurisdiction in the Pierce Transit boundary.

Upon inquiry, Mr. Millstein confirmed that Joint Base Lewis-McChord does not participate in the composition review process.

Vice Chair Whalen provided participation instructions to the public and opened public comment.

There was no public comment given or submitted in advance of the meeting. Public comment was closed.

Sr. Project Manager Monica Adams presented on the item. Commissioners Walker and Kastama <u>moved</u> and seconded to authorize the Chief Executive Officer to increase the contract spending authority with Talakai Construction (Contract No. 1703) by \$2,135,010 for the removal and purchase of approximately 80 additional bus shelters, including solar lighting, for a new contract amount of \$3,073,801.

In 2018 the Chief Executing Officer authorized the sole-source selection of the Remix software (now provided by Via Software).

The Pierce Transit Planning Department uses Remix for fixed route scenario planning and testing of potential routes. It allows planning to plan a route, and then identify predictive schedule and fleet requirements. This software is also used for long range planning and coordination with partner agencies. Another module that is part of this agreement is the Remix on Demand Planning License. This allows planning to predict use of potential new ondemand service areas as well as manage existing Runner Zones. This contract will combine both maintenance agreements together under one contract. FACT SHEET PAGE 2

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends increasing the contract amount by \$175,835.00 to extend the years of service on this contract so that the agency can continue to conduct essential fixed route and on demand planning scenarios of existing and potential routes.

#### ALTERNATIVES:

Do not authorize the contract extension and stop using Remix. This is not recommended as it would remove access to a tool that our planning department relies upon.

#### BACKGROUND:

The GenFare system comprises the fareboxes on the buses, the infrastructure in the new Fuel and Bus wash building to update and empty the fareboxes, and the IT systems to monitor and ensure fidelity of the money as it moves from the buses to the bank.

Genfare was selected as a sole-source vendor in 2018. There are over 300 fareboxes on both Sound Transit and Pierce Transit fleets, with an expanded set of infrastructure on the new Fuel and Bus Wash building. The contract gives Pierce Transit access to the technical resources for additional years to make sure the fareboxes are operating efficiently and the supporting infrastructure is updated. Any disruption risks losing fare money. It would be cost-prohibitive and disruptive to replace these fareboxes.

#### ALTERNATIVES:

Do not authorize the contract extension and do not have software support and maintenance, however, the system may not operate without it and this approach is likely unsustainable.

#### **RECCOMENDATION:**

Staff recommends authorizing the Chief Executive Officer to approve extending Genfare Contract No. 1036 in the amount up to \$438,140, ensuring continued support for the farebox systems.

Software House International (SHI) offers the most competitive pricing among approved resellers in Washington State, and Pierce Transit is leveraging Contract No. 05116 from the Washington State Department of Enterprise Services for this Agreement.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the Chief Executive Officer to approve extending the Software House International Contract No. 1210 for the Microsoft Enterprise Services License Agreement in the amount up to \$2,250,00 which ensures ongoing access to Microsoft products and updates, including the latest security patches, which are essential for maintaining productivity and security at the agency.

#### ALTERNATIVES:

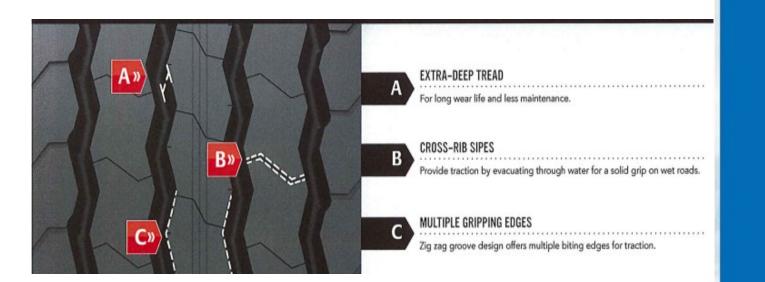

BACKGROUND:

Pierce Transit leases tires on a per mileage basis and three full-time skilled service personnel maintain and service the tires and wheels at Pierce Transit's Maintenance facility. Service personnel perform tire changes, tire mounting, torquing, wheel balancing, tire inflation and tire delivery services, among other duties. The contractor supplies all tires, weights, valves etc., to keep all coaches fully equipped, compliant, and with enough spares to ensure uninterrupted service.

Pierce Transit publicly advertised the Request for Bid on February 22, 2024. Bid were due on March 15, 2024, and one bid was received from Bridgestone Americas Tire Operations, LLC. Historically, Pierce Transit has received only one or two bids for this procurement as there is a limited number of companies that can provide the specialized tires and the trained service personnel required to perform the work.

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends entering into a multi-year contract with Bridgestone for the lease of tires and service personnel. Bridgestone Americas Tire Operations, LLC, has provided quality tires and service personnel to perform the work for

the previous seven years and has a good reputation with Pierce Transit as well as other local transit agencies. The price is in alignment with the existing costs for the current contract and has been determined to be fair and reasonable.

#### ALTERNATIVES:

Reject bid and authorize staff to rebid the service in hopes to obtain more bids. The bidder submitted a responsive bid and is a responsible bidder so releasing another bid is not a viable alternative. Additionally, there is a limited number of companies that could provide the specialized tires and service personnel.

#### BACKGROUND:

Pierce Transit has achieved the Association of Washington Cities (AWC) WellCity Award for the past three years with our efforts to support employees through the agency's Wellness program. The agency is also a 2024 Golden Apple Award recipient in recognition of the organization's commitment to employee wellness. To continue to encourage participation in the Wellness program and annual activities, and to enhance the employee experience as outlined in the Strategic Plan, the agency seeks to add two Wellness Days to the benefit plan for the non-represented staff and for employees in Public Safety Officer job represented by IAM Local 297. Wellness Days are included in the recently ratified ATU contract. This proposed action would expand the Wellness Day benefit to all employees.

To qualify for Wellness Days, each employee would be required to participate in a scheduled Wellness activity which counts toward the AWC WellCity criteria and would be required to participate in the annual Wellness Survey. The Wellness Days would be provided to employees starting in January 2025, provided they met the criteria the previous calendar year.

Wellness Days are similar to Personal Holidays in that they may not be carried over from the previous year; they must be used in the same calendar year or would be lost. Wellness Days have no cash out value at separation.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt the attached proposed resolution to provide two (2) Wellness Days for qualifying non-represented and IAM represented employees starting January 2025.

#### ALTERNATIVES:

The alternative is to reject the proposal to add the Wellness Days to the non-represented and IAM represented employee benefit plans. This is not recommended as the agency aims to obtain parity amongst the workforce.

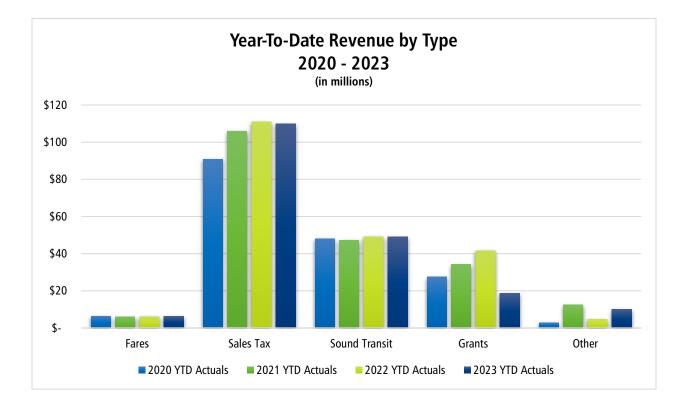

#### Highlights from 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter:

Other revenue has the largest gains over budget. The majority is earned interest on investments fueled by higher interest rates. Grant reimbursements are also above budget. Approximately 82% is attributed the remaining ARPA and Youth Ride Free funding. Sound Transit reimbursement and Fares are performing at the expected budgeted amounts. Sales Tax was declining in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> quarters ending the year slightly under budget by 0.69%.

#### **Revenue Definitions**

Fares – Revenues for actual services provided and include fixed route, SHUTTLE and Vanpool services. The current average fare per boarding is \$0.71. The last adult fare increase was in 2010.

Sales Tax – This revenue source provides most of our operating revenue and is based on taxable sales within the Pierce Transit Public Transportation Benefit Area. Currently, Pierce Transit only collects 0.6% of the 0.9% allowable sales tax rate.

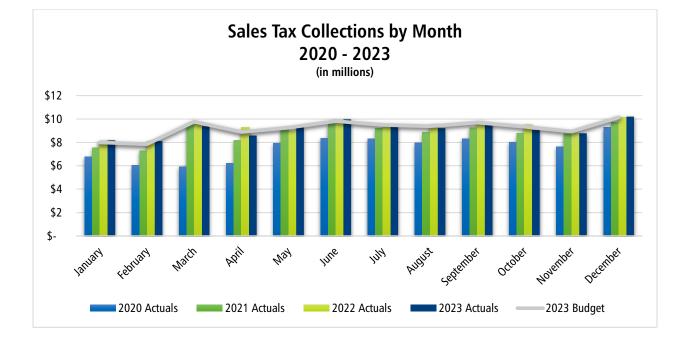
Sound Transit – Are reimbursable expenses for Pierce Transit providing regional transit service from Pierce to King County on behalf of Sound Transit. Reimbursements are based on the costs of services at an hourly rate for service hours required to provide the service.

Grants – Revenues to offset costs of running services. Included in grant revenues are Commute Trip Reduction and Special Needs Operations. These revenues are provided by Pierce County and Washington State.

Other – Other includes interest and advertising revenues that are received with more consistency as well as revenues that cannot be classified in one of the other revenue types.

#### Sales Tax Collections by Month



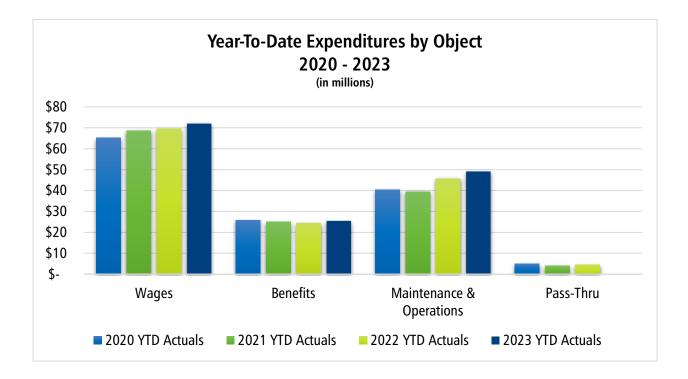

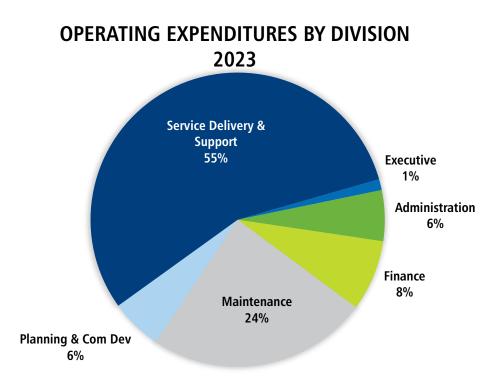
Overall operating expenditures are under budget by 10.39% when compared to the annual budget. All categories are under budgeted expectations. The main cause is vacant positions in Maintenance and Service Delivery. Our largest expense category is personnel costs, currently 66.49% of the overall expenditures.

No non-departmental pass-thru payments have been made to Piece County as part of the 5307 agreements in 2023.

#### **Operating Expenses by Division**

Pierce Transit consists of six divisions: Executive, Administration, Finance, Maintenance, Planning & Community Development, and Service Delivery & Support. Approximately 70% of our budgeted operating expenditures are wages and benefits for personnel. 867 or 88% of our personnel is included in Maintenance and Service Delivery & Support.

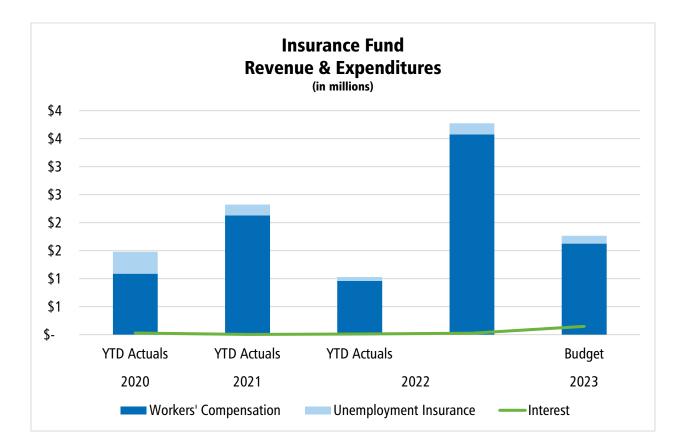

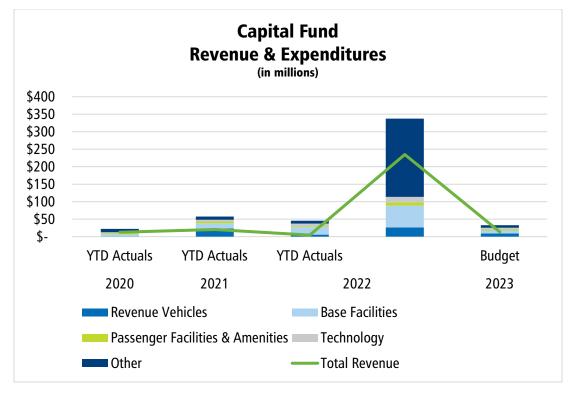


#### **Capital Budget**

Capital Fund is designated to provide funding and budgets for projects that meet the guidelines of capital, broadly defined as greater than \$5,000, or aggregate purchases over \$50,000, and useful life of more than one year. Capital projects are budgeted for the full amount in the year that they are added to the capital portfolio. Any unspent budgets are carried forward to the next budget year along with any remaining funding. Funding for projects is received from Federal, State, and other sources and is project specific. Expenditures over revenue are covered using reserves and transfers from the Operating Fund. Classifications of capital expenditures are defined by the National Transit Database (NTD).

#### **Balances**

Ending balances include the required reserves for the operating, insurance, and capital funds. The Board of Commissioner's reserve policy supports management decision-making by avoiding revenue-expenditure imbalances, supporting stable service delivery, and assuring funds are available for operations, self-insurance programs, and planned capital acquisition during economic downturns or other unanticipated events.

#### **Reserve Requirements**

**Operating**: A minimum of two months of agency operating expenditures of the current year and is currently \$27.1 million.

**Insurance**: An adequate level to protect the agency from self-insurance risk. The level is reviewed periodically and is currently \$1.2 million.

**Capital**: A minimum of 50% of the previous three years average of annual asset depreciation at any point in the Six-Year Financial Plan; 100% in the final year of the Six-Year Financial Plan and is currently \$8.5 million each year and \$17.0 million in the final year.

#### **Budget Revisions & Amendments**

Budget revisions are done when the approved budget moves from one account to another. Revisions do not have a financial impact on the agency budget. Budget revisions do require the Board of Commissioners' approval when capital projects are increased by \$50,000 or more cumulatively over the life of the project.

Budget amendments occur when unforeseen expenses are expected, and the agency budget is increased. Budget amendments require Board of Commissioner approval. Below is a list of changes made to the budget in 2023 and a table showing the new fund balances caused by the changes.

Budget Revision & Amendment Highlights:

2023 Beginning balances were up \$50,482,315 compared to budget due to underspending the budgeted 2022 year-end estimates agency wide. The 2023 Bus Replacement project was increased by \$5,836,330. This was offset by \$4,669,060 in FTA funding. The balance of closed projects in 2023 increased our capital reserves by \$1,488,978.
